African American Women Growing collection of state and national women's club records, and women in various professions.

Dance Photographs, costumes, personal papers, and programs pertaining to professional dancers and TWU's Dance Department.

Organizations Texas Women's clubs, professional organizations for women's activism and accomplishment.

Women in Aviation Individual women, and organizational records of women, who served in the British Air Transport Auxiliary, and many others.

Athletics College and university athletic organizations; the first Texas state wide organization to manage intercollegiate sports for women.

Educators Women educators, student papers, college scrapbooks, TWU's educator history, and teacher organizations.

Activism and Politics Suffrage, temperance, Texas equal legal rights, organizations, and Texas political leaders.

Health Sciences Nurses, physical therapists, TWU's health science program, history of nursing, military nursing, and one of the first women dentists in Texas.

War Time and the Military WACs, WAVES, Marines, Coast Guard, Red Cross, home front activities, military nurses, and veterans of the Gulf War.

Authors Journalists, novelists, historians, and poets, primarily from Texas, but also includes other writers.

### Complete

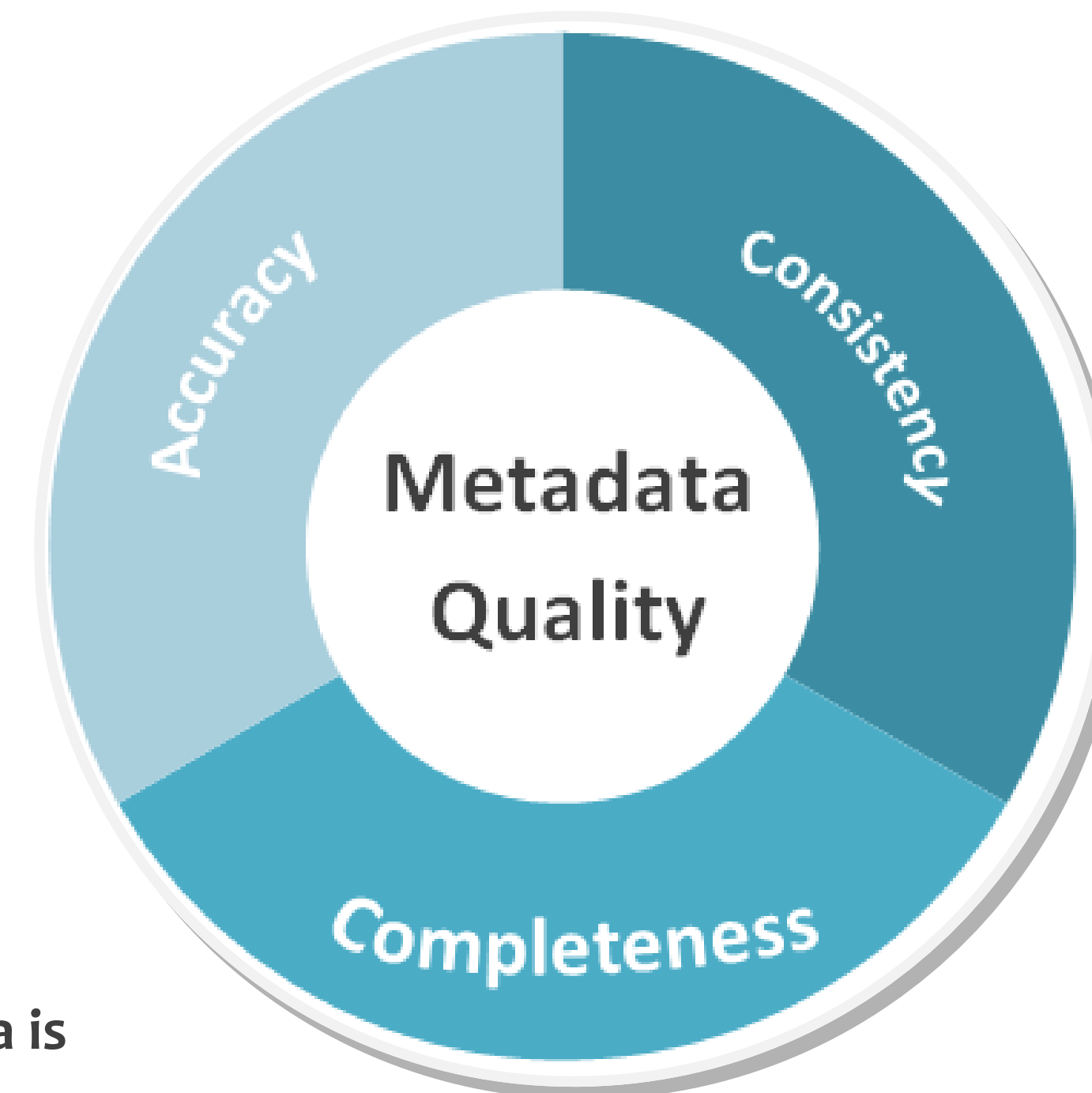
Ensure that required fields are populated in all records and optional fields are applied when necessary

### Accurate

Implement guidelines for control and use a tool for checking spelling and punctuation

### Consistent

Follow a protocol for data entry to guarantee that data is uniformly entered

Bio.Historical.Note	Edna Gardner Whyte (WG #10) took her first flying lesson in 1926 and became one of the first pilots in the country to receive an instructor's rating. She funded her flight instruction through her work as a nurse. During WWII Whyte trained military pilots at Meacham Field and later enrolled in the Army Nurse Corps. She received her helicopter rating February 19, 1951. She was a friend and colleague of Amelia Earhart and was president of the Ninety-Nines from 1955-1957. She owned and operated three flight schools during the course of her lifetime, participated in over 300 air races and won over a hundred awards and trophies. She continued teaching flight lessons well into her eighties. She was inducted into the Air Space Hall of Fame in 1984 and the Texas Women's Hall of Fame in 1985.

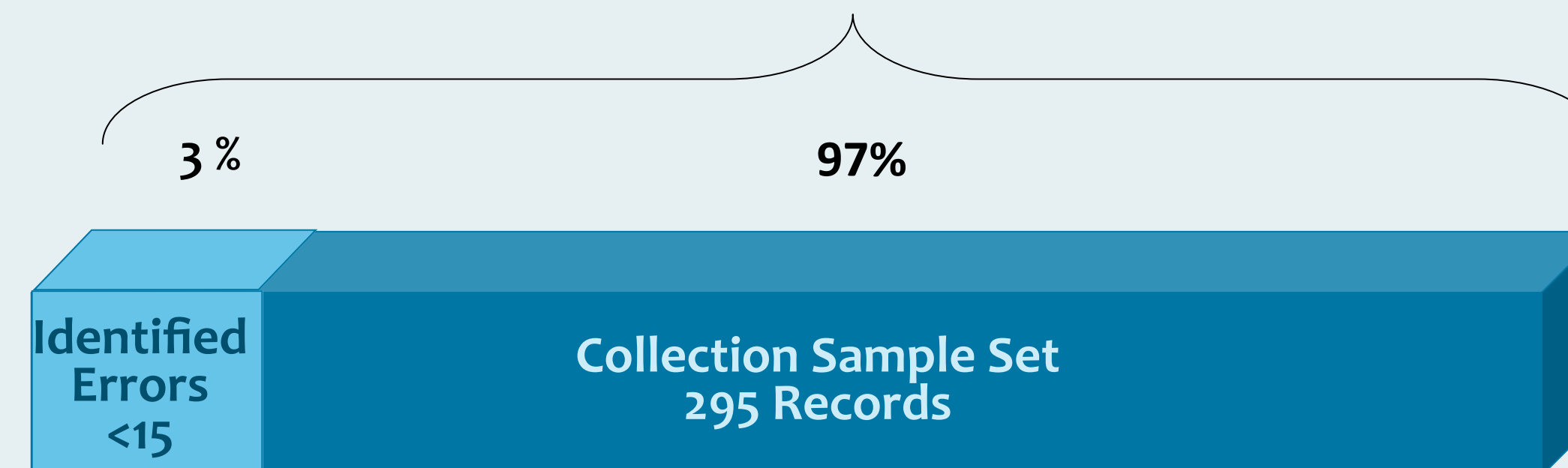
