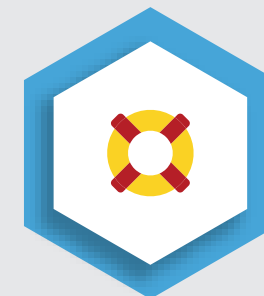

Migration Support for all versions of Fedora (3.x, 4.x, and 5.x) to Fedora 6.0

Documentation and tooling available



Improved Performance & Scale

Built-in support for metrics, so you can measure Fedora's performance in real-time using Grafana

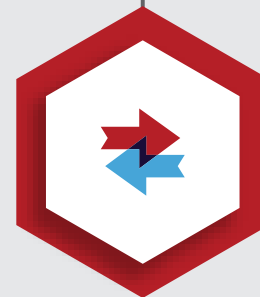

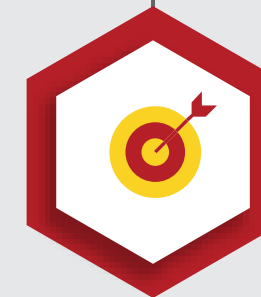

Enhanced Digital Preservation

The OCFL enhances preservation support by providing a transparent file and folder layout that is readable by both humans and machines.

Future versions of Fedora will comply with the OCFL = no need for further migrations



Built in Search

Perform simple search operations without relying on an external index (e.g. Solr, Elastic Search)
